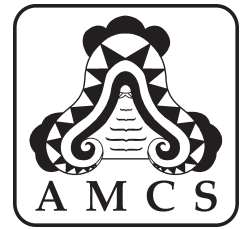

- AMCS Bulletin 9. *Hydrogeology of the Sistema Huautla Karst Groundwater Basin*. By James Smith. The author's masters thesis. Huautla is the second-deepest cave in Mexico. Cave maps, area geology, dye-tracing results. Newly typeset, 2002. 154 pp softbound. \$18
- AMCS Bulletin 10. *Caves of the Golondrinas Area*. By Peter Sprouse and Jerry Fant. Famous Sótano de las Golondrinas, with foldout map, and 67 other caves in the mountains west of Aquismón, SLP. 2002, 74 pp softbound. \$6 (was \$15)
- AMCS Bulletin 11. *Cave Hydrology of the Caribbean Yucatan Coast*. By Patricia A. Beddows. The author's masters thesis on an area with over 350 kilometers of underwater caves. 2003, 96 pp softbound. \$10
- AMCS Bulletin 12. *Ancient Maya Cave Use in the Yalahau Region, Northern Quintana Roo, Mexico*. By Dominique Rissolo. The author's PhD dissertation, reformatted from the 400-page original. 2003, 142 pp softbound. \$12
- AMCS Bulletin 13. *Geologic Studies in the Purificación Karst*. By Louise Hose and Gerald Atkinson. A masters thesis on the geology and hydrology of the area and a paper on the biostratigraphy of two limestones in the area, newly typeset. 2004, 87 pp softbound. \$10
- AMCS Bulletin 14. *Karst Hydrology of the Sierra de El Abra, Mexico*. By John Fish. A PhD dissertation on this area and its caves, newly typeset, with a foreword by Derek Ford. 2004, 186 pp softbound. \$18

- AMCS Bulletin 18. *Modeling the Groundwater Catchment of the Sian Ka'an Reserve, Quintana Roo*. Bibi Ruth Neuman and Malene Louise Rahbek. A joint M.Sc. thesis from Denmark. The lagoons and marshes are fed by a karst aquifer and are in danger of pollution. 2007. 209 pp softbound. \$15.
- AMCS Bulletin 19. *Proceedings of the X, XI, and XII International Symposium on Vulcanospeleology*. Edited by Ramón Espinasa and John Pint. Abstracts and papers from the 2002, 2004, and 2006 symposia, plus field trips guidebook for 2006 in Mexico. Includes CD with the bulletin in PDF format and some supplementary material. 2008. 305 pp plus CD, softbound. \$15.

- Reprint 1. *Mexican Caving of the Southwest Texas Grotto 1966–1971*. Edited by Mike Walsh. Published by the SWT Grotto, 1972. Similar to AMCS Bulletin 1 in design and format, and also a valuable guide to classic caves of Mexico; out of print for 25 years. Reprint 2001, 146 pp softbound. \$20
- Reprint 2. *Proyecto Cerro Rabón, Mexico, 1985–1989*. By T. Bitterli, P.-Y. Jeannin, K. Meyers, and Ph. Rouiller. The initial exploration of the caves on this high ridge in Oaxaca, including that of Kijahe Xontjoa to –973 meters. In English (including most of the exploration narrative) or German (including most of the cave descriptions); numerous excellent maps. Originally published by Speleo Projects, 1990; reprint 2001. 58 pp stapled. \$9
- Reprint 3. *Proyecto Pápalo Expedition Report 1986–1989*. Carol Vesely and Bill Farr. The initial exploration of Sistema Cheve (then called Sistema Cuicateca) to 1243 meters deep and 16.3 kilometers long. Originally published 1989; reprint 2002. 17 pp stapled. \$3
- Reprint 4. *Las Cavernas de Cerro Grande: Estados de Colima y Jalisco*. By Carlos Lazcano. Published by Univ. de Guadalajara, 1988. Ninety-four caves, with details and maps of about thirty most important. In Spanish. Reprint 2002, 144 pp, plates. See Reprint 5.
- Reprint 5. *Las Cavernas de la Sierra Gorda*. By Carlos Lazcano. Published by Univ. Auton. Querétaro and SMES, 1986. Massive study of area in Guanajuato and Querétaro; 562 caves, 230 cave maps. In Spanish. Reprint 2002, two volumes, 180+206 pp. Available together with Reprint 4 as PDF files on CD. \$3
- Reprint 6. *Balankanche, Throne of the Tiger Priest*. By E. Wyllys Andrews IV. Published by Tulane University, 1970. Most important archaeological cave in Yucatán. Includes music-format CD of Mayan orations recorded in the cave. Reprint 2005, 182 pp + CD, softbound. \$16
- Reprint 7. *The Hill-Caves of Yucatan*. Henry C. Mercer. Classic nineteenth-century report on archaeological expedition, originally published 1896.
